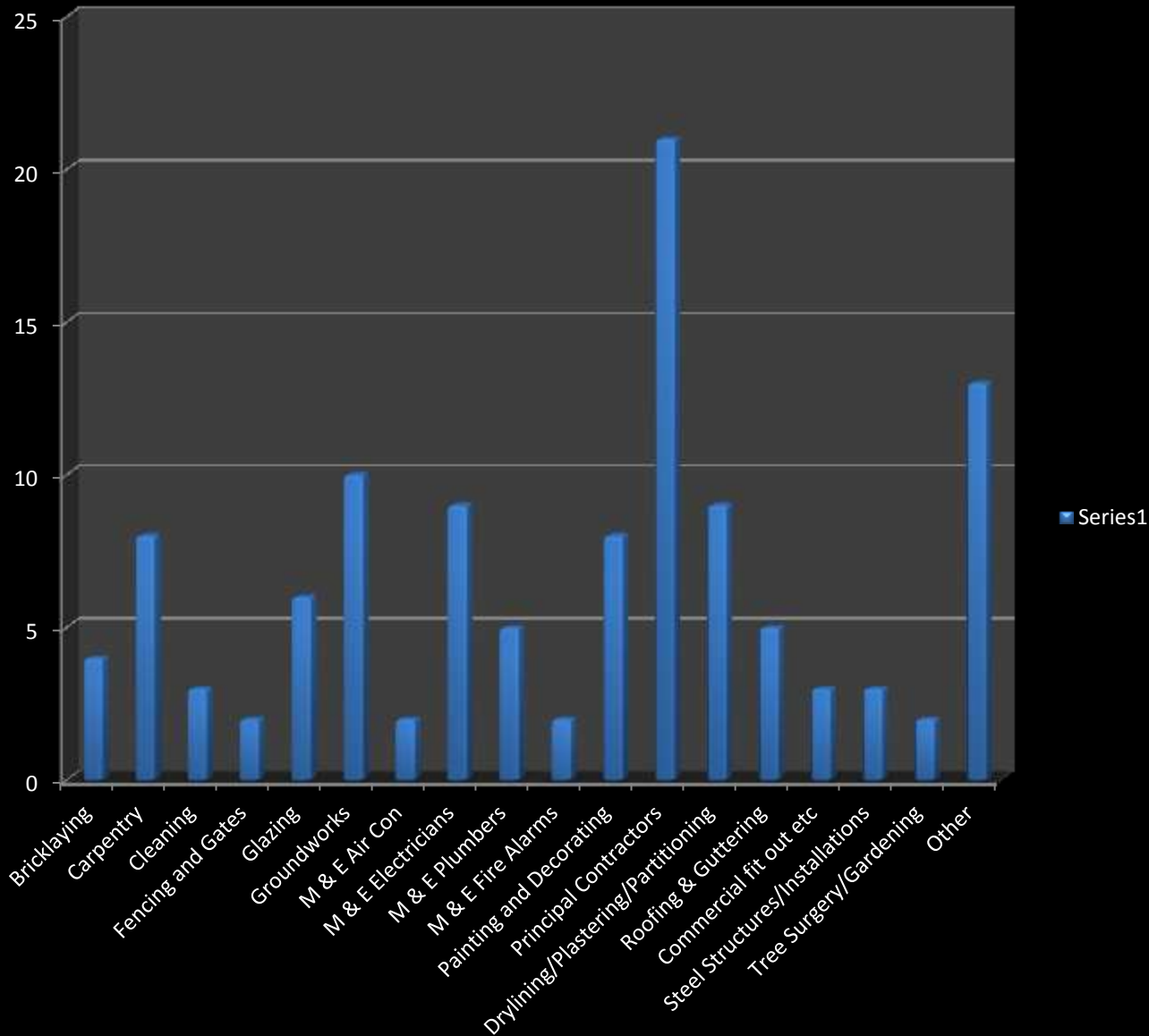

Legal News :



- Changes to RIDDOR
- Only Fatal and Major Injuries to be reported by phone
- +3 day injuries to be reported on line
 - F2508 Report of an injury
 - F2508 Report of a Dangerous Occurrence
 - F2508A Report of a Case of Disease

Further changes to RIDDOR in the future:

- 3 day injuries will become 7 day injuries
- We will let you know as soon as this happens



Accident round up

- NEW: no charge for RIDDOR investigations
- PLEASE... let us know STRAIGHT AWAY
- We will get there as soon as we can
- Do not move anything
- Take photos
- If you are a subcontractor: let the PC know we are coming

Accident Frequency rate

HCS Safety Member Clients:

Total number of RIDDOR Reportable accidents
= 9

X 100,000 (lifetime working hours)

÷ Total Number of hours worked this year
(2668 x 40 x 48 = 5,122,560)

9 x 100,000 ÷ (5,122,560) = 0.175

Network Rail: 0.23

Mansell: 0.18

Last year: 0.22



RIDDOR Round-up

RIDDOR	Injury	What happened?	Trade
+ 3 days	broken finger	Shortcut across party wall resulting in fall	Bricklayer
+ 3 days	back injury	Slip through tower, poor landing	Roofer
+ 3 days	back injury	Manhandling plasterboard into building from scaffold	Dryliner
+ 3 days	back injury	Trip following short cut down closed off stairs	Painter
+ 3 days	rotator cuff damage	Fall through scaffold as a result of poor support for boards	Bricklayer
+ 3 days	Crush injury	Fingers crushed against wall by pallet of blocks during lifting operation	Crane operator
+ 3 days	Crush injury	Finger crushed while lifting cable drum	Electrician
+ 3 days	Back injury	Nerve and muscle damage while moving furniture	Carpenter
Major	Fractured arm and shoulder	3m Fall through plasterboard ceiling into fire exit below	Service Engineer

Others

- Disc cutter accident – kickback resulting in facial laceration
- Fall from lorry while unloading resulting in fractured skull – 2 weeks in coma, outcome uncertain
- 1 accident reported by a client that was not actually reportable – PLEASE ASK!!
- 2 x cable strikes
- UK figures...



UK RIDDOR Figures for 2010/11

- In construction there were 50 fatal injuries
- An increase of 19% from last year

Importance of monitoring

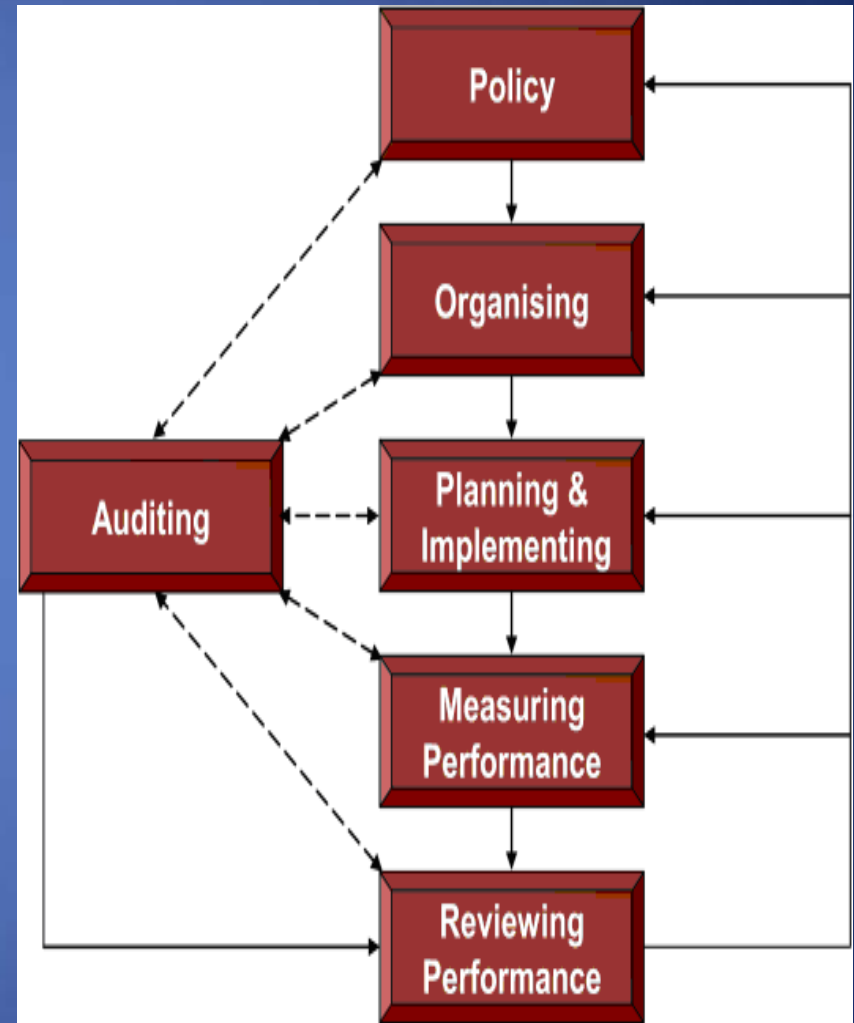


- Site Inspections

 - For PC's – are you complying with the Construction Phase Plan

 - Site inspections
 - Health questionnaire
 - Plant/machinery inspections
 - Accident figures and reports
- **Audit and Review**
 - Annual meeting
 - Report format to change next year
