Who is the course for?

The Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2015 are far reaching and significant for anyone who has a role to play in a construction project: Clients, Designers, Principal Designers, Contractors or Principal Contractors. This is essential to understand the new duties, notification requirements and documentation. Big changes in the legislation from CDM 2007 mean that a good understanding is essential.

What's in the course?

Course content includes an overview of the origins of the legislation, the reasons behind the changes and the objectives of the Regulations.

Through interactive exercises and quizzes, delegates will gain a confident working knowledge of the duties of the different duty holders and leave feeling aware and ready to implement the changes within their own organisations.

We will also examine the relationship between the duty holders and the need for cooperation between Principal Designer and Principal Contractor, with a focus on handover of the Pre Construction Information and the Health and Safety File.

Domestic projects are also included within the scope of the new regulations to a far greater degree than before so we will look at the impact these changes will have on small builders who tend to work for private clients as well as those involved in commercial work.

Assessment

Following completion of the course, delegates will be required to pass a multiple-choice test.


